
These groups made submissions to the consultation for their Newport sites charities Riding for the Disabled and the Huntingtons Disease Association.

immediately published by UDC.

The release on the website included the loading of 38 supporting documents, at least one of which was prepared by Sworders AFTER the final close date.

In contrast, very many submissions by individuals, and by bodies such as the CPRE (Campaign to Protect Rural England) and Save Newport Village, have remained unpublished two weeks and more after submission (they are online submissions requiring only a brief check by an administrator).

After complaining to UDC about the slowness of publication we were assured that remedial measures were being taken, but we have seen no evidence of this. And we doubt if individuals or residents' organisations would be allowed

to overstep the deadlines, or be given fast track privileges.

The council has some problems. According to the schedule the 'final' plan should now be produced. But with the almost total rejection of the current proposals they must surely do a further consultation on a draft before going to a

So we urge them to now stop doing the builders' bidding and instead work with residents and residents' groups to develop a sensible plan. plan based on common sense instead of nonsensical predictions, which provides affordable housing, and which does not overload our towns and villages.
