CONFIDENCE IN THE COUNCIL'S PLANNING SYSTEM

Our confidence in the planning system at UDC has been further weakened recently by the way two controversial planning applications in Stansted are being handled. We are making these complaints in an effort to ensure that transparency and democratic representation are fully made possible.

Our specific complaints relate to applications UTT/13/1618/OP at Walpole Farm, UTT/13/1126/FUL at 14 Cambridge Road and UTT/13/1456/FUL at 10 Cambridge Road.

All are in Stansted and are, at the latest information we have, due to come to the planning committee on 28th August 2013. This is Bank Holiday Week. This is the busiest holiday week of the year. We will both be away on holiday. We also understand that Cllr J Rich will be on holiday that week. This means that none of the Stansted members will be able to attend the committee to make representations on these controversial planning applications in our community.

Moreover, both Cambridge Road applications were due to come before the committee on 31st July. On 16th July the case officer told ClIr Dean that the reports had been completed ready for internal review. Three days later we were told that the reports were not complete. We have been denied an explanation for this delay.

Between 3rd July and 19th July ClIr Dean corresponded with **a sector of** a highways officer at ECC and **a sector of** the case officer at UDC over seemingly inconsistent and contradictory planning procedures for assessing respective on-site parking at the two Cambridge Road application sites. On 22nd July Nigel Brown wrote to block further correspondence on this issue despite the fact that ClIr Dean's questions had not been answered. This issue has been the cause of consternation to the applicant and his agent. On 18th July revised plans for 14 Cambridge Road were posted on the UDC website. There has been no consultation on these, nor has any answer been given to ClIr Dean's raising of this point by email. All correspondence is attached to this letter.

All of these applications are of major and strategic concern to the community of Stansted and its elected representatives. It is unacceptable to us for officers to change the date of the Cambridge Road applications at the eleventh hour and to obscure the reasons for this in correspondence with no better reason than "there is no conspiracy". (See Andrew Taylor's email of 22nd July.) The Dunmow and Stansted Observer of 18th July quoted on its front page a reason for delaying taking to committee the Fairfield application in Elsenham: that it is a controversial application that should not be decided in a peak school holiday week when many members of the public will be away. This has since been denied by officers as being a valid reason for delay. Yet it is a reason that was placed in the public domain by the council. We feel that it would be unhelpful to the council's reputation to be seen again to be inconsistent in its treatment of controversial applications in Stansted.

In conclusion, our complaints are:

- 1. that officers are being inconsistent in the way they treat the evaluation of on-site parking at adjacent planning application sites in Stansted;
- that officers have changed the committee dates for controversial planning applications, having previously claimed their reports were complete, without giving any reason;
- 3. that officers are intending to place controversial planning applications before the planning committee in the peak school and general holiday week when they have recently claimed such coincidences should be avoided; and when all local members are also on holiday;
- 4. that officers are failing to be transparent and have refused to answer questions about the planning process regarding on-site parking, recent changes to plans and the cause of delays.
